Summary of shelter in place order (3/23/20)

Only 3 reasons to go out: Essential Activities, Essential Government Functions, To operate Essential Businesses.

- Public or private gatherings OF ANY NUMBER are prohibited.
- All TRAVEL except essential travel is prohibited.

Public transit only for essential activities, only 10 people allowed on the bus at one time, maintain 6-foot social distancing requirement

Essential Activities allowed under the order include:

- Activities related to health care for family or pets For example: Picking up medicine or medical supplies or visiting health care entities (not including fitness or gym facilities)
- Picking up supplies needed to work from home
- Picking up food or cleaning supplies for example at a grocery store NOTE: only one person from any family should go to the store at a time to reduce crowding and ensure appropriate social distance
- Picking up food at a restaurant NOTE: standing in line or in a crowd at a restaurant while
 waiting on food is a violation of social distancing requirements. 6-foot space between all
 individuals is required.
- Caring for a family member or pet in another household
- Outdoor activities For example: walking, running, biking. Maintain 6-foot social distance requirements.
